REMEMBER S.A.L.U.T.E.

Provide as much information as possible when reporting possible activity by ICE or federal agents. Spread information, not panic!



S

Size / Strength

How many agents? How many vehicles?

"4 agents, 2 SUVs, no license plates"



A

Activity / Action

What are you seeing? A raid at a workplace?
A traffic stop? Are they using force?

"Harassing workers in my shop"



L

Location / Direction

Address? Intersection? Nearby landmarks?

"At Kimball and Armitage, Chicago"



U

Uniform / Clothing

What are they wearing? Do they have masks?
Vests? Badges? What do they say on them?

"Civilian clothes that say DEA on the back"



T

Time and Date

What is the time and date of the sighting?

"11:15 AM on September 4th"



E

Equipment / Weapons

What equipment/weapons? Are they using them?

"They have handcuffs and batons"

DOCUMENTING IS ESSENTIAL TO INFORM THE COMMUNITY CLEARLY AND SUPPORT PEOPLE IMPACTED OR AT RISK. Be as specific, concise, and precise as possible.

Keep in mind:

- **You have the right to document activity in a public space or on your property.** Officers cannot search or seize your phone without a warrant.
- The best way to document is to **use your phone to record** what happens. Your phone must be **visible** to the agents.
- The **best practices** for recording videos **safely** are:
 - Stay at a **safe distance**.
 - Narrate what you see, considering **S.A.L.U.T.E.** State the location and time. You should describe where you are and what you see, or perhaps what happened before you started recording.
 - **Hold your phone horizontally** to capture as much of what's happening in the video as possible.
 - Try to capture the whole scene
- **Do not post or share the video on social media.** Immediately contact the Illinois Family Support Network at **855-435-7693** to report the incident and to find out how to securely send the video to those who can help.
